RESPONSIVE READING 1 John 4:7-21

Leader: Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God.

People: Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love.

Leader: God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him.

People: In this is love, not that we loved God but that God loved us and sent God's own Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins.

Leader: Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another.

People: No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and God's love is perfected in us.

Leader: By this we know that we abide in God and God in us, because God has given us the Spirit.

People: And we have seen and do testify that the Parent has sent their own Child as the Savior of the world.

Leader: God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God.

So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

People: God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them.

Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as God is, so are we in this world.

Leader: There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love.

People: We love because God first loved us.

Leader: Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen.

ALL: The commandment we have from God is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters and all their siblings also.

TIME WITH CHILDREN

SCRIPTURE READING Acts 8:26-40

Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road — the desert road— that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Candace (which means "queen of the Ethiopians").

This one had gone to Jerusalem to worship, and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet.

The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it."

Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked.

"How can I," the other said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.

This is the passage of Scripture the eunuch was reading:

"He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before its shearer is silent,

so he did not open his mouth. In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth."

The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus.

As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?" And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing. Philip, however, appeared at Azotus and traveled about, preaching the gospel in all the towns until he reached Caesarea.
